While the Code of Ethics provides ethical direction within which a Nursing Practitioner's practice should be framed, it will not provide solutions for day-to-day ethical dilemmas in practice, but the individual nurse practitioner will often need to rely on his/her own personal integrity to make the right decisions.

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Nursing ethics is a branch of applied ethics that concerns itself with activities in the field of nursing. Nursing ethics shares many principles with medical ethics, such as beneficence, non-maleficence and respect for autonomy. It can be distinguished by its emphasis on relationships, human dignity and collaborative care.
