When you want to write a manual that helps your user to solve problems, you first need to define who your user is. This can be done by creating a user profile, also named a persona. With a persona, you make some reasonable assumptions about the characteristics of your user.

It is usually written by a technical writer, although user guides are written by programmers, product or project managers, or other technical staff, particularly in smaller companies. User guides are most commonly associated with electronic goods, computer hardware and software, although they can be written for any product.

The first step in writing a good user manual is to get the actual writing process as far away from the engineers as possible. The software developer knows more than anybody what makes the software work, but that doesn't mean the developer should write the guide. On the contrary, it is a distinct disadvantage.
