A methodology for assessing language vitality and endangerment. In 2002 and 2003, UNESCO asked an international group of linguists to develop a framework for determining the vitality of a language in order to assist in policy development, identification of needs and appropriate safeguarding measures. This Ad Hoc Expert Group on Endangered Languages elaborated a landmark concept paper entitled “ Language Vitality and Endangerment ” ,

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which established the following nine criteria :

A group of linguists and language advocates worked in collaboration with UNESCO from November 2001 and March 2003 to formulate ways of assessing language vitality and produced a set of guidelines that are given below.

Degrees of endangerment. The present edition designates the degrees of endangerment a little differently than the previous editions. The new terminology is based on UNESCO ' s Language Vitality and Endangerment framework that establishes six degrees of vitality/endangerment based on nine factors. Of these
