What is the difference between DPI, PPI, resolution and ...

Higher resolution displays may require higher sensitivity or higher mouse DPI to attain the same amount of on-screen movement, or one would need a ridiculously large mouse-pad. Sensitivity is software based. It gets your dpi and divides or multiplies it to get the final dots-to-pixels sensitivity. It is just a multiplier of the input sent by the mouse. For example, if you had the mouse on 3600 DPI and then set the sensitivity to 2.5/10, it would function the same as 900 DPI on 10/10 sensitivity.

In the context of screens, DPI (Dots Per Inch) or PPI (Pixels Per Inch) refer to the number of device pixels per inch, also called " pixel density ". The higher the number, the smaller the size of the pixels, so graphics are perceived as more crisp and less pixelated.

Dots per inch (DPI, or dpi) is a measure of spatial printing, video or image scanner dot density, in particular the number of individual dots that can be placed in a line within the span of 1 inch (2.54 cm). Similarly, the more newly introduced dots per centimeter (d/cm or dpcm) refers to the number of individual dots that can be placed within a line of 1 centimeter (0.393 in).

Screen resolution is typically written as 1024 x 768 (or 1366 x 768, 1920 x 1080). This means that the screen has 1024 pixels horizontally and 768 pixels vertically (or 1366 pixels horizontally and 768 pixels vertically, and so on).
