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 SOLUTIONS OF SELECTED PROBLEMS Problem 36, p. 63 If  $\mu(E_n) < \infty$  and  $f_n \in L^1$ , then  $f$  is a.e. equal to a characteristic function of a measurable set. Solution: By Corollary 2.32, there exists a subsequence  $f_{n_j} \rightarrow f$  a.e.. Let  $A = \{x : f_{n_j}(x) = 1\}$ . For  $x \in A$ ,  $\{f_{n_j}(x)\}$  is a sequence of 0's and 1's, so its limit can be either 0 or 1.

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
